COVID-19 Guidelines (including rapid response)

1.) On entry to the facility, staff will be completing contact tracing, including obtaining the name, phone number and email address of the attendee

****Note – this will be done individually for all attendees, including minors present with adult parents/guardians. Edmonton Soccer Association strongly recommends completing Contact Tracing pre-registration, which will assign a number to each individual and speed the information collection process.**

2.) Participants entering the facility will be asked the recommended screening questions including questions regarding travel, health, and COVID-19-specific symptoms, as well as exposure to current COVID-19 cases.

a. Anyone not able to answer these questions satisfactorily will be asked not to enter the facility on the given day until symptoms improve or conditions are met.

3.) Mask use in the general public areas of the facility is currently mandated, including on mezzanine spectator levels. Mask use on-field is not mandatory, with the exception of league-specific regulations.

4.) If an attendee becomes sick with suspected COVID-19 symptoms while at the facility, the following will be done:

a. Preparations will be made for the attendee to leave the facility as soon as possible.

i. Should the attendee need access to dressing rooms or other areas, hand washing or hand sanitizing will occur prior to doors being opened, and the attendee will be requested to put on a mask as soon as possible.

b. Should there be a delay in being able to leave the facility (for example, waiting for a ride), limited access areas such as first aid spaces will be utilized to ensure 2m of distance from others and promote isolation.

c. Should the individual not have access to personal transportation (and normally take public transportation to/from the facility) the coach of the team will be requested to transport the individual unless the individual is sick enough to warrant an ambulance being called.

d. If the individual is not sick enough to warrant an ambulance, it is recommended that they call Health Link and follow all testing, isolation, and notification recommendations.

e. While the individual is isolated and/or leaving the facility, staff will take precautions to clean and sanitize the “high-touch” areas the individual may have had access to, including doors and handles on the field areas, player benches and red-capping on the field areas, handles and push surfaces on dressing room and entry doors, etc.

f. Staff will complete a general report advising of the incident for administrative staff to utilize.

g. Administrative staff will notify Alberta Health Services to begin contact tracing processes and provide additional recommendations.
