Title: Air Quality Policy

1. Background	One of EMSA's objectives is to ensure the health and safety of each individual participant and ensure that all individual participants have equal access to all EMSA Programs regardless of their religious affiliation, ethnic background, cultural heritage, or lifestyle orientation.
2. Issue	Due to recent changes in weather patterns forest fires are impacting our programs every year. Whether the fires take place in Alberta or BC, the quality of our air is significantly impacted.
3. Policy	 <u>ALL</u> City Wide and Club games will be played as scheduled unless otherwise stated by EMSA Main. That is the default position of the League. EMSA Main is following the Government of Canada Air Quality Health Index in order to assess air quality: <u>https://weather.gc.ca/airquality/pages/provincial_summary/ab_e.html</u> <u>During weekdays</u>, the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) must be 6 or lower at 4pm (regardless of when it was calculated) for all games to proceed as scheduled. If at 4pm, the AQHI is 7 or higher at your game's location: one of the 4 Edmonton substations, Red Deer, St. Albert, Sherwood Park, Spruce Grove or any other

location in Alberta, the League will issue a notice of postponement for the affected location.

- On the weekend if 1 (one) hour prior to an Edmonton-and-area game, or 3 (three) hours prior to a Red Deer or out-of-district-participating team game, the AIR Quality Health Index is 6 or lower at your game's location: one of the 4 Edmonton substations, Red Deer, St. Albert, Sherwood Park, Spruce Grove or any other location in Alberta, the games will proceed as scheduled.
 - If 1 (one) hour prior to an Edmonton-and-area game, or 3 (three) hours prior to a Red Deer or out-of-district-participating team game, the AQHI is 7 or higher at your game's location: one of the 4 Edmonton substations, Red Deer, St. Albert, Sherwood Park, Spruce Grove or any other location in Alberta, your game will be canceled.
 - The league will not issue cancellation notices on the weekends.
 Playing out of town teams, please ensure you look at the AQHI for that location.

Further Clarification:

If the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) in the general Overall Edmonton Region is listed:

- Between 1 and 6 overall (at 4pm regardless of when it was calculated): the games that evening will proceed as scheduled. If the Air Quality changes after that it will be up to the official to cancel at the field. All teams must show or forfeit the game.
- 7 and above (at 4pm) at your Game location (Red Deer, St. Albert, Edmonton, or Spruce Grove) regardless of when it was calculated: the games that evening will be canceled by the league and rescheduling procedures will take effect.
- The Edmonton substations will cover the following areas:

0	Edmonton East – for the area south of the river and east			
	of Calgary Trail.			
0	Edmonton McCauley – for the area north of the river and			
	east of highway 2.			
0	Edmonton South - for the area south of the river and			
	west of Calgary Trail.			
0	Woodcroft - for the area north of the river and west of			
	highway 2.
